Q — I was wounded in Vietnam, and am supposed to be separated from service at a military hospital. Will I receive counseling or information about veterans' benefits before separation?

A — Yes. A VA contact representative will visit you at the hospital to advise and assist you in filing applications for benefits.

Q — When I am discharged, I plan to start a small business in my home town. May I use the G. I. Bill for this purpose?

A — No. Business loans are available only to eligible World War II and Korean veterans, and not authorized under the new G. I. Bill. Try the Small Business Administration.

Q — Can the Veterans Administration pay burial allowances for former members of the defunct Women's Army Auxiliary Corps?

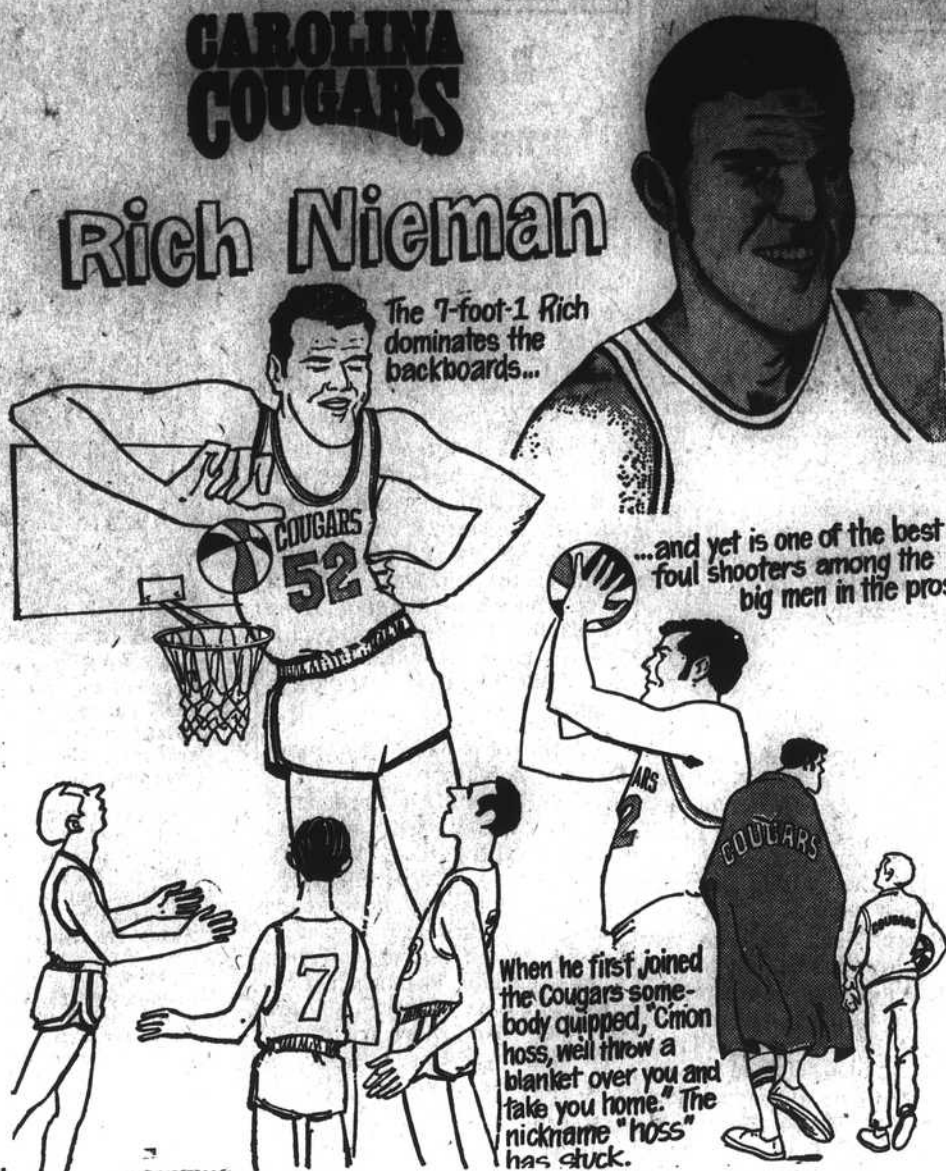
A — Yes. Contact your nearest VA office.

Q — Presently, I receive a VA pension under the "old law." Could I change from the "old law" to the "new law" and then back to the "old law" later?

A — No, once you change from the "old law" to the "new law," you cannot later change back to the "old law." However, the VA will help you determine whether it is to your advantage to be under the "old law" or the "new law."

Q — I am 65 years old and plan to retire soon. Can I convert my present National Service Life Insurance policy to the New Modified Life Plan?

And there is "social intelligence." This is the ability to get along with people; tact; self control; even temper, etc.
