Three Students Charged with Hashish Posssesion Following Friday Search

Following a search of a trailer home south of Kinston Friday night three Lenoir Community College students have been charged with possession of harhish and the necessary gear for use of this extremely potent drug

The trio includes Bruce Edwards of Rocky Mount, Larry Jones of Greenville and Jerry Wayne of Kinston.

ABC Officer Paul Young with Deputies Leo Harper, Bob Gar-ris, and R. B. Sheppard conducted the raid and search.

Young said one of the trio tried to block the door and refuse entry by telling the officers that a naked woman was inside. Another of the trio tried to flush the drug down a toilet but failed to dispose of it all in that manner and more was found in a later search of the trailer.

Hashish is a greatly refined form of marijuana which can be either chewed, eaten or smoked in a pipe. The trio had pipes specially designed for using the material.

All three were place under \$50000 bond and the father of Jones showed up Monday morn- Bright Jr. of 1121 Oak Street ing at the sheriff's office with \$5000 in cash to secure the release of his son until hearing which was set for 10 Tuesday morning.

This is the first hashish that has been found in raids made in Lenoir County although officers have understood that there is a growing use of it in the area since it is so much stronger than ordinary marijuana, and those who use marijuana generally develop a desire for something stronger.

Medically it is accepted that harhish is heroin.

PUSHERS BOUND OVER

The pair was living at 312½ East Cas-well Street in Figster and well Street in Kinston prior to their arrest.

Kinston Schools Get \$101,288 from 'Pacifier Fund' of Federal Tax Money

A total of \$6,446,476 in federal funds has been received by 80 of the 152 administrative units of the state's public school systems since the program began in September.

The Emergency School Assistance Program — Title IV was requested by President Richard Nixon and approved by Congress earlier ths year. The funds are to be used to assist school units in carrying out their desegregation program.

The Kinston School System has gotten \$101,288 from this fund.

Robert Strother, Specal Assistant to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, said that 92 written requests for projects have been received; and although none have been rejected, there are 12 requests "in holding" which means they are either still being reviewed or being delayed - pending more information.
