

Three Students Charged with Hashish Possession Following Friday Search

Following a search of a trailer home south of Kinston Friday night three Lenoir Community College students have been charged with possession of hashish and the necessary gear for use of this extremely potent drug.

The trio includes Bruce Edwards of Rocky Mount, Larry Jones of Greenville and Jerry Wayne of Kinston.

ABC Officer Paul Young with Deputies Leo Harper, Bob Garis, and R. B. Sheppard conducted the raid and search.

Young said one of the trio tried to block the door and refuse entry by telling the officers that a naked woman was inside. Another of the trio tried to flush the drug down a toilet but failed to dispose of it all in that manner and more was found in a later search of the trailer.

Hashish is a greatly refined form of marijuana which can be either chewed, eaten or smoked in a pipe. The trio had pipes specially designed for using the material.

All three were placed under \$50,000 bond and the father of Jones showed up Monday morning at the sheriff's office with \$5,000 in cash to secure the release of his son until hearing which was set for 10 Tuesday morning.

This is the first hashish that has been found in raids made in Lenoir County although officers have understood that there is a growing use of it in the area since it is so much stronger than ordinary marijuana, and those who use marijuana generally develop a desire for something stronger.

Medically it is accepted that the next step up (or down) from hashish is heroin.

Kinston Schools Get \$101,288 from 'Pacifier Fund' of Federal Tax Money

A total of \$6,446,476 in federal funds has been received by 80 of the 152 administrative units of the state's public school systems since the program began in September.

The Emergency School Assistance Program — Title IV — was requested by President Richard Nixon and approved by Congress earlier this year. The funds are to be used to assist school units in carrying out their desegregation program.

The Kinston School System has gotten \$101,288 from this fund.

Robert Strother, Special Assistant to the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, said that 92 written requests for projects have been received; and although none have been rejected, there are 12 requests "in holding" which means they are either still being reviewed or being delayed — pending more information.

PUSHERS BOUND OVER

Two cashiered Marines, who claim New York City for home, were bound over to Lenoir County Superior Court under \$5,000 bond each on charge of pushing marijuana and heroin among teenagers in Kinston. The pair was living at 312½ East Caswell Street in Kinston prior to their arrest.

PAIR BOUND OVER

John Russell of Kinston route 7 and Bobby ay Dixon of 103 South Myrtle Street, Kinston, were bound over to Lenoir Superior Court under \$500 Monday after a hearing in district court in which probable cause of their guilt on charges of breaking, entering and larceny was found.

TWO JAIL TERMS

In Lenoir District Court Monday jail terms were handed to Clarence Alfred Gooding of Kinston route 2 who got 60 days for obstructing traffic and carrying a concealed weapon and Frank Bright Jr. of 1121 Oak Street who got six months for drunken driving, reckless driving disorderly conduct and resisting arrest. Bright ran into the city garbage dump in Southeast Kinston Saturday night.

APPEALS JAIL TERM

Kilby J. Barbee of Kinston route 3 appealed to Lenoir County Superior Court last Thursday after being given six months in prison for his third drunken driving offense, driving without a license, driving an uninsured car upon which there was no license tag.

Carey Road Area Boys Smoking Pot

Tuesday afternoon a concerned citizen called ABC officers Paul Young and Tommy Taylor and told them that a group of young boys were acting strangely in a field north of Carey Road beyond Phillips Road. When the agents arrived on the scene the boys had departed so they observed the field for a several hours. Since no one returned to the location, they searched the area where the boys had been and found a seizable quantity of the strongest marijuana that they have found in the many raids in the Kinston area. The officers noted that the boys had been using leaded copper tubes as pipe and that it is possible to obtain lead poisoning with this combination. They suggested that parents in the area keep a sharp eye on their children and if are acting sickly to be sure they have not smoked from this leaded copper pipe.
