Jessie Ball DuPont Fund (1997). In fiscal year 1997 (ending October 31), the fund made 359 grants to 218 institutions, totaling \$14,951,984. The majority of the money awarded went to support programs addressing societal and institutional needs. Baptist Children's Homes of North Carolina (1997). In fiscal year 1997, BCH served 1,560 children from 1,350 families; exceeded the \$10.1 million "Light Their Way" Campaign with gifts and pledges totaling \$10.2 million; and as a result of that campaign, began construction on three new buildings. BCH endowment continued it's growth, reaching a value of \$22.4 million.
