

No More Payments Accepted For Excess Tobacco Allotment

Tax Payment Warrants Will Continue to be Issued to Contracting Producers Covering All Tobacco Produced, Excess Will be Entered on Cards.

County Agent H. K. Sanders received instructions Saturday, Jan. 25th, to accept no more payments for excess allotments. All contract signers who still have tobacco to sell will present their allotment cards to the Field Assistants at the warehouses just as they have been doing, and the Field Assistants will continue to issue Tax Payment Warrants to contracting producers covering all tobacco produced by them, including excess, and will enter excess on cards previously issued.

If there is space left on any producer's card, he can present this

card to any Field Assistant, and have his sale recorded in the usual manner. However, if the allotment card of any producer has been filled all the way to the bottom of the card, then this producer may call at the office of the County Agent and a new card will be issued without cost.

RESULT OF CASES IN SUPERIOR COURT

Many Defendants Assigned to State Prison to Work Roads of State.

The following cases were disposed of last week in Superior Court with Judge F. A. Daniel presiding.

State vs. George Timberlake—Indictment, second degree murder—continued to next term.

State vs. Leamon Bass—Indictment, reckless driving—verdict of "not guilty" directed.

State vs. Victor Suitt, Ira Suitt and Willie Parker—Indictment, manufacturing whiskey—judgment, Victor and Ira Suitt, 3 months in jail to be assigned to work roads. Willie Parker, 8 months in jail to work roads.

State vs. Le Roy Harvey—Indictment, driving drunk, reckless driv-

ing, damage to personal property—judgment, guilty of both counts. 1st count, 6 months in jail to be assigned to labor. Defendant not to operate a motor vehicle for 12 months. 2nd count, prayer for judgment continued upon condition defendant remain of good behavior.

State vs. James Stephens—Indictment, grand larceny—judgment "guilty." Defendant to be imprisoned in State prison for not less than 10 months and not more than 14. To be assigned to labor.

State vs. Stephen Satterfield—Indictment, grand larceny. Defendant pleads guilty of receiving stolen goods knowing them to have been stolen. State accepts plea—Judgment. State prison for not less than 8 months and not more than 12. To be assigned to labor.

State vs. Floyd Sharks—Indictment—grand larceny. Judgment—

"not guilty." State vs. Floyd Sparks—Indictment, larceny, continued to next term.

State vs. Paul Whisnant—Indictment, grand larceny. Defendant pleads guilty. Judgment, to be confined to State prison for not less than 10 months nor more than 14, to be assigned to labor.

State vs. W. D. Crump—Indictment, breaking and entering. Judgment, 18 months in jail to be assigned to labor.

STANDARDIZATION NEEDED IN COUNTY FOR ALL POULTRY

Would Have a Marked Significance on General Reputation of the County for Poultry Demand.

If the poultry of Person County were standardized (everyone raising the same kind) it would have a marked significance on the general reputation of the county for poultry production and demand.

It would be a striking picture in the minds of people traveling through or in the county, which picture would linger a long time and be an advertisement of the fact; hence turn the attention of outsiders to our county for uniform standardized poultry.

When you buy a standardized commodity or product from the factory or from the field, there is a certain assurance in the purchasing of that standardized product which means much to the purchaser in terms of guaranteed satisfaction. Such would be the case with purchases of standard poultry if the farmers of this county would supply a breed of a certain kind.

In the past, the Barred Rock breed has been selling for a higher price than other breeds of poultry when marketed in large lots. We would be able to secure approximately from one to one-and-a-half cents per pound more for our poultry if all were Barred Rocks of a good quality.

To this end, County Agent Sanders is planning to hold 2 meetings in the county in an effort to enlist the cooperative interest and support of such an undertaking among the poultry growers of the county. The meetings are scheduled to be held some time in February and those interested in working together on this standardization project are asked to watch for the date and place of the meeting and attend.

The Barred Rock breed will be the one to standardize on because of the fact that they have in the past brought a higher price per pound when sold in large lots in the principal markets of our country.

Those contemplating buying baby chicks of the general purpose breeds would assist materially in bringing to pass this desirable goal, if they

would give this matter of standardization of poultry thoughtful consideration and buy the breed that gives the best promise at this time for the best financial returns from the principal markets.

Those who intend to buy baby chicks to replenish their old stock should have their children join the poultry club, where there are children between the ages of 10 and 18 years in the family.
