PIEDMONT HARD HIT BY HEAVY RAINFALL

One Drowned, Highway Damage Totals Thousands of Dollars, Traffic Impeded.

Charlotte, Sept. 30 — One person drowned, highway damage totalled thousands of dollars, traffic was impeded and a power plant was forced to close today because of high waters resulting from one of the heaviest rainfalls in the western Carolinas in the past decade.

Dr. F. H. H. Calhoun, geologist at Clemson college, said 9.92 inches of rain fell there in less than 24 hours.

Heaviest In Piedmont Area
The Piedmont region of the sister states received the heaviest fall, the coastal sections registering only light precipitation.

Greenville, S. C., had 6.50 inches; Chester, S. C., had 5.21 inches, and Winston-Salem, N. C., reported 3.84.

A negro woman, Eugenie Whit, 30, drowned when she drove into a stream between Clemson and Calhoun, S. C.

The Gregg Shoals Power plant, on the Savannah river near Anderson, S. C., was forced out of commission when water rose six feet over the dam. The water was eight feet over the dam at Porman Shoals on the Seneca river.

Concrete Bridge Washed Out
South Carolina highway department officials said a 140-foot concrete bridge between Clemson and Pendleton, S. C., washed away. The damage there was estimated at \$20,000. Numerous other concrete and wooden spans were washed away, the department said, in Greenville, and Chester counties.

Rainfall at other points included: Spartanburg, S. C., 2.82 Anderson 1.90; Charlotte 2.08; Asheville 1.41, and Raleigh 1.16. The fall was accompanied by drops in temperature.

Tomorrow's forecast for the Carolinas was for continued cloudy weather and scattered showers.

SLACK-SCALD METHOD BEST PICKING BIRDS

Gives the Dressed Birds a Very Clean Appearance

FREE OF TORN SKIN

Poultrymen who sell dressed broilers and fowls at retail this year should realize that the slack-scald or semi-scald method of picking the birds is the most satisfactory.

When the slack-scald method is used, dressed birds have the plump clean appearance and the keeping qualities of dry-picked birds, yet they are free from torn skin which is often found on dry-picked broilers.

The slack-scald method consists of immersing the bird for 30 seconds in water heated to a temperature of 126 to 130 degrees Fahrenheit. For broilers the water temperature should be from 126 to 128 degrees, while fowls require a higher temperature of 128 to 130 degrees. Higher temperatures produce scald spots which often result from the ordinary method of scalding, but lower temperatures will not loosen the feathers.

Bleeding must be complete before scalding, otherwise red crops

will result. Move the birds backward and forward in the water to make sure the water reaches the skin through the feathers. Remove the feathers by pulling rather than rubbing them off.

When all feathers have been removed, immerse the carcass in cold water for 15 to 20 minutes, then transfer it to ice water for three hours. This will remove the body heat and improve the keeping qualities of the bird.
