ROSE BOWL GAME TO HAVE \$30,0,000 GATE

Pasadena, Calif., Dec. 12.—Theyre predicting a \$300,000 gate at the Rose Bowl New Year's day. Both Boys and Girls Teams Will Ticket applications for the football game between Alabama and California indicate 200,000 persons want to crowd into the bowl which seats only 88,000.

The gate receipts will be the second largest in Tournament of Roses history. The universities of California and Alabama will get more than two-thirds of the money. Pittsburg and Southern California nia hold the Rose Bowl record for gate receipts, \$306,421.15 in 1930. Records show that in the last 11 years the average attendande has been 65.695; the average gate \$232 .-203.50; the average ticket price \$3.50.
