

# Six States Represented In N. C. Public Health Course

Object To Prepare Men For Work In Health Service Of Various States

Chapel Hill—Six States are represented in the sixth class taking the public health course at the University of North Carolina since the establishment there of the Division of Public Health, of which the eminent Dr. Milton J. Rosenau is the Director.

North Carolina leads in enrollment, with 18, while Georgia, with 13, is second. Other States are represented as follows: Florida, 4; South Carolina, 3; West Virginia, 3; and Virginia, 2.

Of the North Carolina students enrolled, 6 are doctors taking the course prescribed for public health officers, one is an engineer, 8 are sanitarians and 3 sanitary officers.

All from Florida are taking courses prescribed for sanitarians and sanitary officers. Both enrollees from Virginia are in the non-medical group, while the South Carolina students consist of two taking training to become sanitary officers and one is a sanitary engineer.

One doctor is registered from West Virginia, taking the course prescribed for health officers, while the other 2 from the State are in the non-medical group. From Georgia there are 7 doctors and 6 engineers.

### Able Faculty In Charge

New members of the faculty this fall include Dr. Norton, formerly assistant director of preventive medicine for the State Board of Health, in Raleigh, who is professor of public health administration, and Dr. A. J. Sheldon, instructor in public health.

Other faculty members include: Dr. Milton J. Rosenau, who is professor of epidemiology; Dr. H. G. Baity, professor of sanitary engineering; Dr. D. A. MacPherson, professor of bacteriology; Dr. Harold William Brown, professor of public health, who is teaching preventive medicine; Prof. H. B. Gotaas, assistant professor of sanitary science; Dr. Carl V. Reynolds, State Health Officer, North Carolina State Board of Health.

### To Promote Efficiency

The objective of the Division of Public Health is to offer comparatively short courses best adapted to equip personnel for the special responsibilities of health work, such as public health ad-

ministration, epidemiology, vital statistics, sanitary engineering, public health laboratory methods, child hygiene, etc. The curriculum covers a twelve weeks' period and includes intramural instruction, laboratory exercises, health surveys, and field work. Following this, a month with the field demonstration unit is required for North Carolina trainees, while the other States establish their own requirements for practical experience.

"In brief," explained Dr. Reynolds, North Carolina State Health Officer, "it is the purpose of these courses to constantly raise the standards for and to increase the efficiency of those engaged in public health work. The minimum requirement for entrance into the school of public health now is that the entrant shall have at least a high school diploma and a course in chemistry and biology.

**Results Evident, Reynolds Says**  
"A survey of health workers shows conclusively that the standards are being raised steadily and satisfactorily. In other words, we are determined that every public health worker shall be assigned. This is in keeping with the forward trend of things, and certainly in a field as important as that of public health there must be no lagging, if the maximum results are to be obtained for those who are investing their money in this work, through the taxes they pay, and those the work is designed to help."
