
## Workers Busy Building America's Largest Ship

# **Commission Approves Amendment To** State Unemployment Compensation Law

to clarify, simplify, and improve the State Unemployment Compensation Law, as finally adopted by the State Advisory Council of the Unemployment Compensation Commission, have been approved by the Commission and submitted to Governor Hoey, for of the contributions, the remainintroduction in the present General Assembly session.

The State Advisory Council has been at work on these amendments for six months, at several meetings of the Council and others of committees, and have secured tentative approval tion paid from his account in any of the Social Security Board in Washington to the changes. This "experience rating" plan, referred to as merit rating, provides for three years of payments before a reduction can be made in the rate of any empoyer, and paid. indications are that a \$25,000,000 fund will be accumulated before such a reduction can be made. This plan is intended to encourage and reward stabalized and regular employment.
