# FIELD TRAINING

Raleigh, N. C .- Eight intelligent and personable young Tar Heels who are expected to greet five million visitors to the North Carolina exhibit at the World's Fair will be experts in the subjects of their state. That is the promise of the N. C. World's Fair Commission, which has created the state's exhibit.

Rep. Bill Fenner of Rocky Mount, chairman of the commission, and Coleman Roberts of Charlotte, executive in charge of the exhibit, annonuced that the four young men and four young women who compose the exhiweeks training period about April 10 to equip them for their six-months' long job in New

The training will include a two weeks tour of the state when the personnel will acquaint themselves with the various sections. and the attractions and opportunies in each, so that they may intelligently answer the thousands of questions which visitors will put to them. Several hotels and resorts have already invited the World's Fair personnel to study their communities, and other sections will be visited as opportunity exists. The training trip is being made through the courtesy and hospitality of the various communities visited.

Before starting the tour, the personnel selected will have two days of class work to ground them in the type of information to be sought, and they will also study the type of questions most frequently asked in inquiries directed to the state. After the tour, three more days of classwork will review and consolidate the information gained.

Roberts said today that only educated and poised persons would be employed for the staff, and that as a result of the extensive training period he expected the state's representatives to be the most alert, best informed, and hospitable in the fair

#### **FARM QUESTIONS** ANSWERED

Question: Should any treatment be given sweet potatoe plants before transplanting?

Answer: Where soils are infected with stem rot or wilt organism, the stem and roots of the plants should be dipped in a 20-20-50 Bordeaux mixture or dusted with a mixture composed of 25 percent monohydrated copper sulphate and 75 percent lime just before planting. The scurf infected roots and stems should have a thorough coating of sulphur immediately before transplanting. All treated plants should be set in moist but not water logged soil.

Question: What is the best material for control of leaf spot

and scorch in strawberries? Answer: The best sprey at present is a 4-4-50 Bordeaux mixture. The mixture calls for four pounds of copper sulphate (bluestone) and four pounds of chemically hydrated lime to 50 gallons of water. Smaller or larger amounts should be prepared in the same proportions. Disolve the copper sulphate in one-third of the water, using a wooden. earthenware, or copper container. The lime is put in the remaining water and, when the two are prepared, pour the copper sulphate solution into the lime suspension. The two should be stirred constantly while mixing. Start spraying about the time plants resume active growth
