




However, if the wheat, barley or other small grain has grown to any considerable height, the harrow might injure the grainespecially if the stalk has begun to joint.

to case will credit be given in excess on one unit for each acre LESPEDEZA: All lespedeza that has not been seeded should be put on the field just as soon as possible. The weather this spring has been so unfavorable for field work that a number of farmers have not finished sowing lespedeza. If this is to be seeded on small grain crops or any other seed that has not been recently prepared, the land should be harrowed with a section harrow either before or after seeding the lespedeza. If lespedeza is seeded on top of small grain land without harrowing, washing rains may come and float the unharrowed seed into puddles, This will give a very uneven stand, with many bare spaces in between bunches of lespedeza that are far too
