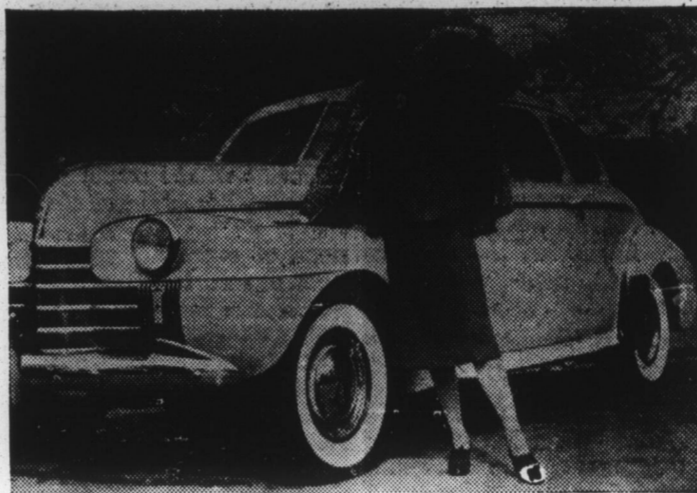

So. Boston Leads Virginia Markets

South Boston, Va., Nov. 15 — Figures released today by Henry M. Taylor, State statistician of the Crop Reporting Service, shows that South Boston, with an average of \$16.31, leads all Virginia tobacco markets in average during the crucial month of October. This figure is 97 cents above the State figure of \$15.34.

During this week, two growers have hit the peak in single pile sales with \$65 averages, while one grower averaged \$47.40 for his entire load. Other full-load averages of \$46.26 and \$46.01 have been recorded. Monday's sale 676,058 pounds, averaging \$18.15.

President Mack Announces Profits

Walter S. Mack, Jr., President of Pepsi-Cola Company, announced today that the estimated consolidated net profits of the Pepsi-Cola Company, and its subsidiaries, for the nine months ending September 30, 1939, according to unaudited company figures, are approximately \$4,630,000. This is after deducting estimated income taxes and estimated depreciation, but before deducting payments made in connection with settlement with C. G. Guth et al amounting to approximately \$350,000. This shows earnings on the above basis of approximately \$17.72 a share on Pepsi-Cola stock for the first nine months of this year. This compares with estimated net profits for the nine months ended September 30, 1938 of \$2,775,000, an increase of approximately 67 per cent.
