Approximately 20 candidates have survived the early work and are being readied by Coach Hendrickson for the initial game of the season next Friday night with Morris-Harvey college, of Charleston, W. Va., here on the Elon floor.

Captain Lloyd Whitley, Jack Gardner, John Henry Pearce Lincoln Manzi and Max Zyvith are varsity men returning. Zyvith took the place of Whitley who was injured early in the season last year. The only man lost by graduation was Ike Fesmire who captained the five last

In addition to the five veterans of last year who apparently will form the first five this season Trouper, Says there are W. L. Hobson, and Douglas Moss, lettermen, and Leading Man Isidore Kravitz, Claude Lawrence and R. D. Apple of the reserve list returning.
