Annual Health Report Issued

The annual report of the Orange - Person - Chatham District Health department for 1939 has just been released by the association and copies are now available at the Health office in Roxboro.

The report shows that heart diseases caused more deaths in Person county during 1939 than any other disease, 23 being the total number.

Cerebral hemorrhage and apoplexy claimed 16 as did pneumonia. Influenza caused two deaths during the year.

SCANDINAVIA BONDS EXPAND RECOVERY
