## Appeal Made To Drivers Who Fail To Dim Headlights

Raleigh, April 10.—Bombarded with requests to "do something" about the menace of glaring headlights on the highways of this State, Ronald Hocutt, Director of the Highway Safety Division, this week appealed to enforcement officials of the state and individual drivers to cooperate in stamping out this widespread traffic hazard.

"Glaring headlights are a menace to the safety of all who ride and walk upon the highways at night," said Hocutt. "The driver who is blinded by the headlights of an approaching car may sideswipe that car, run off the road, strike a bridge abutment, or run down a pedestrian whom he cannot see. And the really serious aspect of the matter is the fact that so few drivers regard glaring headlights as dangerous and attach no importance to dimming their lights when meeting another car."

"I'd like to see every North Carolina driver practice headlight-dimming as a matter of commonsense and courtesy, because that is all it is essentially. Clayton Services But if the drivers refuse to cooperate, then I hope the enforcement officials and courts of the State will wage an unrelenting campaign against glaring headlights," Hocutt said.
