Illness Is Fatal To Scout Leader

Burlington, Aug. 12 — Henry Jackson Overman, 38, educator, nationally recognized for his work died early Sunday at St. Loes Hospital, Greensboro, following two weeks of critical illness. A native of Alamance county, he was a son of Andrew Jackson

and Virginia Underwood Overman. Funeral services were conducted from Pleasant Hill Christian church, of which he was a member, Monday afternoon at four o'clock by the Rev. M. A. Pollard, Greensboro. Interment was in the church cemetery.

A graduate of Wake Forest college in 1928, he had taught in Sylvan, Staley, Saxapahaw and Eli Whitney schools. He was chairman of leadership training in Rural Scouting, east Alamance district, organizer of Tribes 46 and 29, and had the distinction of never having had a boy leave either of his tribes after organization. Cherokee Council awarded him the Silver Beaver in 1939 as the most outstanding Scouter. In his possession at the time of death was a flag from the King of England which he had planned to unveil at a monument he was erecting in memory of British soldiers who died and were buried at Snow Camp.
