Sawmill Hand Dies After Being Thrown From Mule

Rites Held For Chase City Negro Yesterday At His Home. Survived By Wife and Mother.

Loy Mills, 43, Chase City. Va., Negro engaged in "snaking" logs at a sawmill near Roxboro, died Friday morning about 9:30 o'clock from injuries received when thrown from the back of a runa-way mule.

Investigating officers, Person County Coroner, Dr. A. F. Nichols, and Sheriff M. T. Clayton, called to the scene of the accident, about 12 miles from Roxboro off the Oxford highway, reported that the man's lefft leg became caught in a trace chain when he fell off the bucking mule and that the animal dragged the Negro a considerabe distance over a ploughed field and a forest roadway filled with stumps. He was dead when the mule finally stopped on the road near a truck.

Mills, employed by F. A. Jackson for the sawmill owner, J. F. Huddleston, had been in Person county about a week. His head was severely cut and he received numerous body bruises. Coroner's jury was not summoned but Dr. Nichols consulted a number of men working in the vicinity and attributed death to head injuries. Mills was, however, alone at the time he was thrown.
