While the largest percentage of Negro talent in the 15 year history of the New York tourney was winning the seven other medals, Philadelphia captured the team title with 21 points. New York finished second with 18; Buffalo, third with 13; Newark. N. J., fourth with seven, and Washington, fifth with six

Now it may seem strange or it may seem natural, but any way you figure it the colored boys were in there fighting, and they came through in great style.

Can this little bout be any indication that negroes are paying more attention to boxing than white boys?




