Grand Jury Absolves Oakley Of Blame For Manslaughter

Dan Loftis Wins Freedom From Same Charge In Court Trial.

Acquitted of manslaughter Tuesday was Dan Loftis, young Roxboro white man tried in Ferson Superior court before Judge Leo Carr, of Burlington, after the case had been brought up from recorder's court last month. The charge resulted from the death of Willie Royester, Semora Negro, riding on a wagon said to have been struck by a car driven by Loftis.

Not a true bill was returned by the Grand Jury in the case of Clarence Oakley, also of this city, who had been charged with manslaughter in connection with the death of Jim Henry Walters, Roxboro Negro, struck by a car said to have been driven by Oakley. This action of the grand jury ends criminal charges in a case of general interest here .
