Ery flies took 4 prizes with the balance of the winners being quite evenly divided among other popular lures.

Nylon lines according to Western were used by 29 lucky entrants and 20 of the 190 prize winners were taken with fly rods.

MATSUOKA SEES WORLD CHANGES IN DEATH OF OLD ORDER

New York, May 31—Japanese Foreign Minister Yosuke Matsuoka declared that the present world crisis must end either in destruction of modern civilization or in establishment of new world order, Domei, Japanese news-gency reported in a radio broad-

cast. Matsuoka, addressing teachers at the Ministry of Education, again declared Japanese loyalty to the three-power Axis pact, proposing a single modification. He said that the original text of the pact was drawn up by the Japanese government and that both Germany and Italy had accepted this text without proposing a single modification.
