## Football Prospects

Since there are so many Carolina boys in Person county we are glad to print the following article concerning football prospects at this institution for 1941. The article was released by the publicity department of Carolina.

A pitching paragon and running marvel of the likes of Jim (Sweet) Lalanne and an All-American, glue-fingered end like Paul Severin aren't to be found on the University of North Carolina's 1941 football squad, but the Tar Heels of this fall appear to be a hustling group of youngsters with about the same speed and manpower of their 1940 predecessors.

Gone are such stalwarts as Lalanne, Severin, Tackle Gates Kimball, Center Bob Smith, and Fullback Sid Sadoff, and each will be sorely missed. Each did yeoman service and was particularly invaluable in the major scraps with Tulane, Duke, Fordham, Texas Christian University and Wake Forest.

But barring the draft and other off-season losses, the Tar Heels will have 23 lettermen back to provide a nucleus of two veterans for every position except fullback and right end. The squad bulks slightly larger than usual in quantity, but the final quality is yet to be determined.

During the off-season drills last winter Coach Ray Wolf made several shifts in an effort to strengthen needed positions. That two major moves sent Mike Cooke from fullback to center and Dick White from left guard to right tackle. Letterman Bob Whitten was transferred from right to left guard. Other minor shifts sent Fred Stallings from left tackle to right guard, and Wray Lewis from center to right tackle.

Biggest loss at the ends will be All American Severin, a standout performer for three seasons. A merry battle has developed at the left terminal between Letterman Pinky Elliot, who played well until an injury forced him out in mid-season, and Jack Hussey, a big, strapping 190-pounder from the freshman ranks. Craven Turner, another yearling prospect, is just a step behind Hussey and Elliot. Loviek Corn and Paul Wilson, two other yearling rookies, are other candidates at left end.

The status at the guard positions is about the same as last year. Gwynn Nowell, 198-pound regular last fall, heads the aspirants at the left guard with Bob Whitten, another letterman, as his first lieutenant. Reserve Henry Webb and Sophomores Marvin Cheek and Vance McGirt will be on hand to assist Nowell and Whitten.

Indications are that the 1941 team will be more of a running outfit. Pecora, O'Hare, LeBlanc and Cox all lack the passing finesse of Lalanne, but despite that the Tar Heels are expected to do their share of passing. Like the 1940 team, Carolina will probably stick mainly to single wingback, and use double wingback sparingly if at all.
