
## Remodeling Of Older Homes Is Quick Method Of Obtaining Houses Needed For Defense Workrs

S127 Calviness Wilson Holeman Rains Improve **Electric Power** Area Supplies

> Raleigh July 17-Recent heavy rains which seemed to have been general throughout the Southeastrn states have served to improve greatly th hydro-electric supply. The Carolina Power and Light Company, however, is still delivering large amounts of power for defense purposes outside of its territory, L. V. Sutton, president and general manager,

Pointing out that the rains had not only materially improved his company's water supply, Mr. Sutton said he had been informed that many of the reservoirs at other hydro-electric stations in the Southeastern states had been filled.

There is a general improvement in the water supply at our hydro-electric generating stations, actually we have been spilling water over the dams at two of them, and within the last few days have shut down completely one of our steam electric generating plants,' Mr. Sutton said. This steam plant can be placed back into service upon short notice," he added in the event that present relief is of a temporary nature."
