The Olive Hill Home Demonstration Club met in the community house last week for its regular meeting, with the president, Mrs. K. C. Wagstaff presiding.

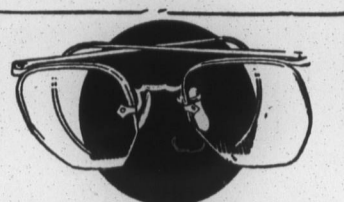
A playlet, "The Wheelbarrow," given by the following 4-H club girls, Hilda Adcock, Margaret

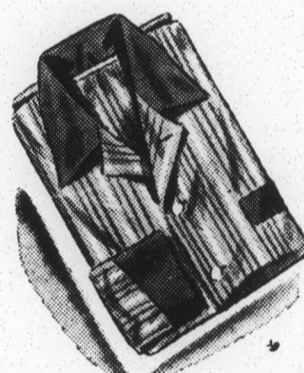

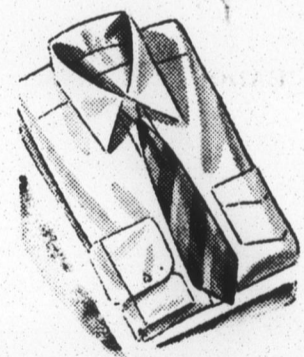
