At the close of Mr. Pittman's speech, he urged the P-T. A. to be a leading factor in keeping the cafeteria alive and seeing that the children are sent to school in the best possible condition.

Miss Louise Croom, member of the health department, gave a review of the health situation in the school. This was interesting as well as informative to the parents of the school.
