

### Tobacco Sales Prices High For Closing Season

North Carolina warehousemen sold 424,474,167 pounds of tobacco for growers to December 1 for a total of \$127,096,618. Farmers have received \$29.94 per hundred pounds compared with \$17.44 for sales to date last year. This is

an increase of \$12.50 per hundred or 72 per cent. The value of sales to date is 52 per cent above the valuation of last year's flue-cured warehouse sales. Warehousemen reported paying farmers \$83,568,318 for the 1940 bright leaf crop. November producers' sales totaled 24,583,715 pounds compared with 73,525,536 pounds sold during this month of last year. The average price, reported at

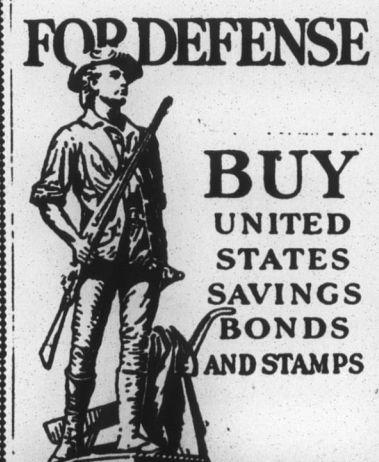
