### Who May Join the WAAC

An applicant must:

- Be a woman citizen of the United States.
- Be between 21 and 44 years of age, inclusive.
- Submit satisfactory proof of date of birth and citizenship.
- Have an excellent character.
- Pass a mental alertness test.
- Qualify according to the height and weight chart.

When she has completed her training, she will take her place with the Army, prepared to relieve some soldier for front line communications duty. WAACs are trained in many specialties, so that job-bound soldiers may be released for combat work.
