

### WOMAN'S CLUB STATE SESSION HELD LAST WEEK

#### High Point Host To State Convention.

HIGH POINT, May 2. — The annual state convention of the North Carolina Federation of Women's Clubs closed here last week with a victory dinner at which Mrs. John L. Whitehurst, of Baltimore, Md., president of the general federation, made the principal address.

Activities included memorial rites for Mrs. Lindsay Patterson, organizer and first president of the state federation, at which Miss Adelaide Fries, secretary of the board of trustees, paid tribute to the founder and Mrs. R. H. Latham, of Asheville, read the roll of deceased members.

At the morning session the following district presidents were elected: First district, Mrs. S. P. Gay, Waynesville; fourth, Mrs. James Washburn, Rutherfordton; 10th, Mrs. George Currie, Clarkton; 11th, Mrs. L. Clayton Grant, Wilmington; 12th, Miss Eleanor Suttin, New Bern; 16th, Mrs. Edwin P. Brown, Murfreesboro.

The following selections were made by the nominating committee: American home, Mrs. Aubrey Murray; education, Mrs. J. O. McClelland, Maxton; music, Mrs. T. E. Morton, Charlotte; art, Miss Elizabeth Crews, Walkertown; literature, Mrs. H. W. Daub, Aberdeen; press and publicity, Mrs. Charles C. Doak, Raleigh; legislation, Mrs. J. S. Mitchner, Sallie Southall Loan fund, Mrs. J. M. Hobgood; university extension service, Miss Nettie Robertson; finance committee, Mrs. P. R. Rankin, Mt. Gilead; Mrs. Geddie Strickland, Greensboro, and Mrs. Karl B. Spray.

Resolutions were passed endorsing the salvage for victory program, for cooperating in a state cancer clinic, supporting compulsory school attendance for children 14 and 16 years old, endorsing extension of facilities for care of feeble minded children, backing legislation for a modernized jail system, approving federal aid to education, petitioning Congress for a farm security administration with adequate funds, urging the restoration of adult education in the state and seeking improvement of public literature through the department of public instruction.

In launching another determined campaign to raise \$360,000 in war bonds for equipping a regiment of American soldiers, the federation enlisted the active cooperation of basic training center No. 10 of the Army

air force's technical training command.

A complete clothing issue for a soldier, running the supply gamut from the highest-priced identification tag, was placed on display in the lobby of the Hotel Sheraton, where the federation met.

This was probably the first opportunity for the representatives of the Woman's clubs — and for every citizen passing through the hotel lobby — to obtain a first-hand picture of what it takes to furnish our fighting men with the most durable equipment in the world.

Major Anderson said American women have always aided their sons and husbands when it became necessary to fight for home and country, and history tells us that during the early days of our republic, whole regiments were frequently outfitted with the handiwork of sisters, wives and sweethearts of the fighting men.

"I am sure that the same urge that inspired those patriotic women of yesteryear is now at work within your own breasts, for while times have changed, the basic emotions that motivate American men and women have not.

"Today it is impossible for you to literally manufacture clothing and equipment for a regiment of men, for times have changed. We are fighting a modern war — one that demands that every article of clothing and equipment be of standard quality and design. American womanhood is to be congratulated on its ability to grasp this fact — on its readiness to adopt new method that conform to the age in which we now live and fight. 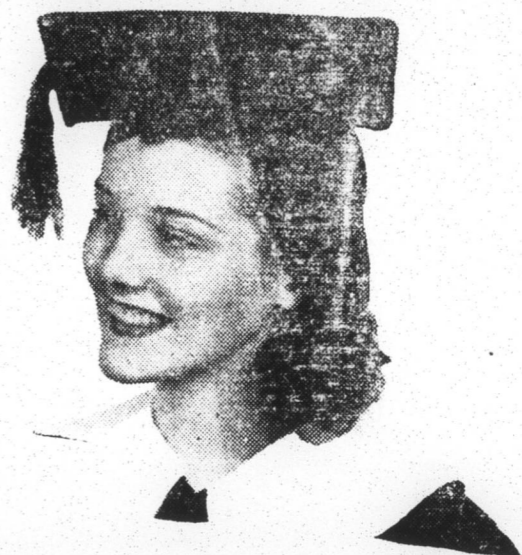

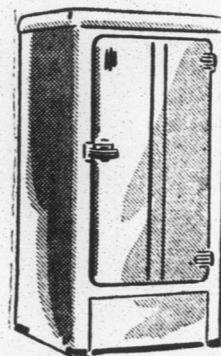

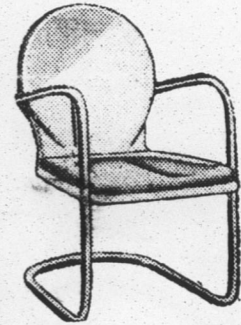
