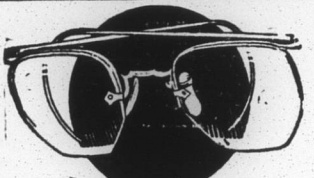

M. Banks Berry, Person County Commissioner, gets appointment as a member of the State Board of Barber Examiners, a position which will require him to resign from the Board of Commissioners and will mean traveling over the State.

Members of the Dixon family, at the home of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Ashley, hold a reunion at which honor guests are Pfs. Grady Gentry and Andrew W. Yarborough.

Person County's tax rate is expected to go to \$1.30 for new year, five cents higher than it has been, but four lower than it was two years ago.

Sgt. Guilford L. Cash, of Rougemont and Gunter Field, Ala., takes a wife, Miss Mary Frances Edwards, of Montgomery, Ala., where both will live.

Thursday, July 8:

Roxboro celebrates its one hundred and fifty years of history by observing "Newspaper Appreciation Week", an idea gotten up by W. Wallace Woods, Chamber of Commerce secretary and participated in both the Times and the Courier. Contained in the Times is a resume of Person County and Roxboro war work, including soldiers in service and Red Cross and War Bond service by civilians. Roxboro, incidentally, was founded in 1793, about four years after George Washington first became president of the U. S.

E. E. Bradsher, Sr., becomes chairman of the Person School board, succeeding the late W. R. Wilkerson.

Roxboro observes the Fourth of July by holding a mass meeting at which Gov. Broughton's "work or fight" proclamation is wholeheartedly endorsed.

The Negro branch of the Person County Public library opens, with Mayor S. G. Winstead as chief speaker.

Thursday, July 1:

Corp. Landon G. Whitt, after twenty months in Porto Rico, comes home on furlough, with good story of what the Army is doing there. He has a new sister-in-law in the WAC and has twice been an uncle since he left Roxboro, seven days after the Cy Winstead episode.

Collins and Aikman employees hear a tale of heroism from Lieut. Robert Dorwart, who was afloat on a rubber raft in the South Pacific for fourteen days. Dorwart speaks at a patriotic rally held at Plant E.

Pfc. Lewell T. Huff, North Africa, becomes probably the first Person man killed in action. In civil life he was an employee of Collins and Aikman. Huff was first reported as missing in action about six months ago.

Miss Annie Mae McWhorter becomes Mrs. Jeff D. Palmer in a home ceremony. Both work in the War Department, Washington.

Canada Training Army Of Scrappers



CANADA'S tough, hard-hitting Army undergoes vigorous training in every form of warfare as it prepares for the day when it will open up a new front against the Axis in the heart of Western Europe. Twenty-seven months after Canada declared War on Germany, 27.8% of the eligible male population of Canada, a total of 681,598, young Canadians had volunteered for service anywhere.

Canadian Soldiers have taken part in raids on the European Coast. Apart from the Dieppe engagement, a Canadian raid on Spitzbergen was the largest raid of this nature. Canadian Soldiers are serving, or have served, in Newfoundland, Iceland, the West Indies and Bermuda. Canadian engineers' units have built roads in Britain and have worked on the fortifications of Gibraltar.

All Canadian Army Training is closely co-ordinated with that of Britain and the United States. Training in Canada is integrated with training in Britain, and there is an extensive two-way exchange of officers between the Canadian Army in Britain and the Canadian Army in Canada. Training of Troops is being brought to completion so far as practical in Canada so that when they are sent abroad they will be prepared for actual combat. The Canadian Army which has stood guard over the British Isles since 1940 is said to be the most highly mechanized and hardest-

hitting fighting force of its size in the world.
