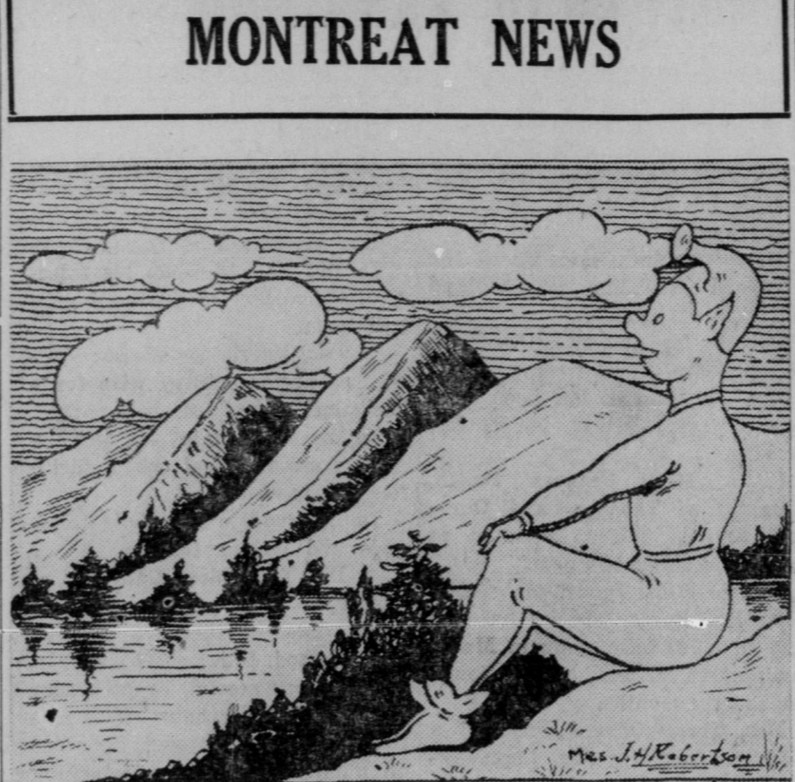

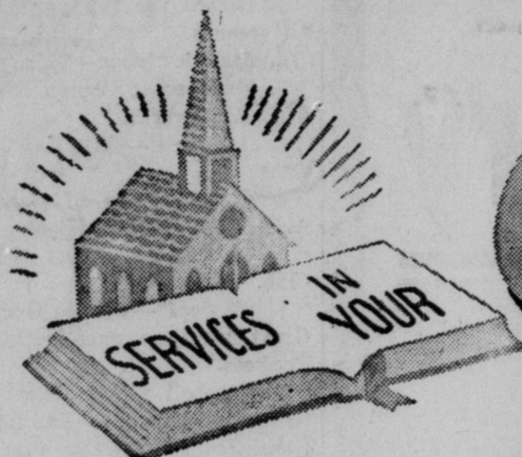


FAVORS FEDERAL AID FOR SCHOOLS
