ed and boss-ridden parents will depend on the intelligence and faithfulness with which this lesson is taught in our churches, and the honesty of heart with which we all receive its truth



Own Economical System The problem of drying soft corn is not the difficult chore it once was, according to farmers who have experimented successfully with fan-operated, forced air sys-


tems installed in their own cribs. Heat is not an essential factor in most installations, particularly when drying operations are conducted in the fall or early spring. The danger in cribbing immature corn is that it may spoil before cold weath-

er arrives to restrain spoilage processes during the winter, or mold during the first few warm spring days. Forced air drying is practical and

economical without heat in temperatures as low as 50 degrees. Higher temperatures, however, speed up and cut costs of drying operations. Karl Mohr, Ohio farmer, for

example, reported having spent \$10 for electricity to crib-dry 60 tons of immature corn by forcing air through it for 100 continuous hours during a period when daytime temperature reached 80 degrees.

Mohr's drying arrangement is typical of workable, successful types which farmers can install


