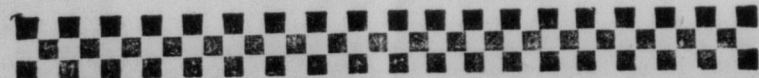

Dr. Chen Chih-mai, Counsellor of China to the United States, is an Internationally famous diplomat Professor of government, Tsing Hua university, 1933-37; lecturer of Chinese government and politics; National Peking university, 1935-37; senior secretary, the Executive Yuan (cabinet), National Government of China, 1938-1944; legal expert, (on administrative law) Supreme National Defense council, 1938-1944; member of Chinese delegation to Dumbarton Oaks conference and San Francisco conference; alternate delegate to UNRRA; delegate to Food and Agriculture organization of the United Nations and International Emergency Food council; advisor to Chinese delegation to the UNESCO Conference, Mexico City.

Dr. Chen Chih-mai is the author of "Parliamentary Opinion of Delegated Legislation" (doctoral dissertation) Columbia University Press, 1933; "Political Science" (in Chinese), 21st printing, 1947; "Chinese Government and Politics," 3 vols. (in Chinese) 1945-46; and other books and articles in Chinese. Obtained his Ph. D. at Columbia.

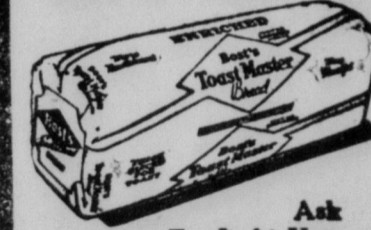
