It pays to grow soil building crops, according to T. A. Anderson of Glenwood and W. E. Ledbetter of Marion, route 2. These men report that their wheat crops averaged 25 bushels per acre this year. A good growth of lespedeza was turned under last fall prior to seeding the wheat, and they say that certainly helped to make the good yields. These farmers agreed that we must protect and feed our soil if it is to feed us as it should.

Howell Buchanan of Departville states that he has several Coveys of young quail on his farm this summer. Mr. Buchanan seeded a wildlife field border last spring and it is looking good. He says that since the border is young and not producing many seed it will be necessary to leave lespedeza around the field edges as food for the quail and other birds.

C. H. Greenlee of Woodlawn began last week to harvest the Kentucky 31 Fescue grass seed in the field north of his home. Mr. Greenlee says he thinks more all the time of his Fescue as a permanent pasture grass, because it can withstand heat and drought and will grow where other grasses will not.
