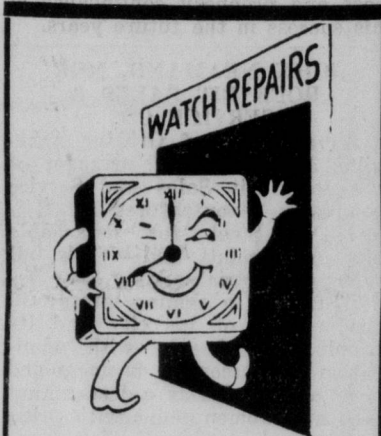
MRS. NORDHIELM HOSTESS TO ACTIVITIES CLUB
