EASY-TO-MIX COFFEE CAKES

Try this recipe for a rich, luscious coffee cake, chock full of nuts and raisins. It will satisfy every palate and make young and old alike come back for more. It's ideal for school breakfast and just the thing for tasty afternoon snacks.

Mix it by the new short-cut method in your electric mixer and serve it with cups of hot chocolate or steaming coffee.

Have shortening or butter at room temperature. Assemble all ingredients and utensils needed. Grease a 9-inch cake pan. Sift flour once before measuring. Grate lemon rind and squeeze juice. Preheat oven to baking temperature 350 degrees.

- ½ cup chopped nutmeats
- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- 1½ cups sugar
- 3 tsp. baking powder
- 1 tsp. salt
- 1 cup shortening
- 1 cup milk
- 3 eggs, unbeaten
- grated rind of one lemon
- ¼ cup raisins (optional)
- 1 tbsps. lemon juice

Sprinkle greased cake pan with chopped nutmeats. Sift together into a large bowl, flour, sugar, baking powder and salt. Add shortening, milk, eggs and grated lemon rind. Bake for about 25 minutes in oven which has been preheated to 350 degrees.

Sour Cream Coffee Cake

- 1 cup sour cream
- ½ tsp. soda
- 2 eggs
- 1½ cups bread flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 tsp. baking powder
- ¼ tsp. salt

Combine and beat well the sour cream, soda and eggs. Add the flour, sugar, baking powder and salt which has been sifted together. Beat the batter until it is smooth. Spread the dough in a lightly greased pan and bake at REV. WALTERS

Butter Topping for Coffee Cakes

Cream: ¼ cup butter with: ½ cup sugar
Stir in: 1 beaten egg
½ tsp. vanilla
6 tbsps. bread flour
Add enough milk to make the topping a good consistency to spread. Spread on coffee cakes that are ready to be baked.

Honey-Bee Topping

Stir and bring to the boiling point over low heat:
½ cup sugar
¼ cup milk
¼ cup butter
¼ cup honey
½ cup crushed nutmeats
Spread these ingredients on coffee cakes that are ready.
