Employment in North Carolina, covered by the Employment Security Law, increased 31.12 percent, or by nearly 150,000 workers in the seven year period from 1940 through 1947, while all nonagricultural employment increased by nearly 250,000, it is shown in a study by S. F. Campbell, director of the Bureau of Research and Statistics, and announced by Henry E. Kendall, Employment Security Commission chairman.

The Mountain Region of the State, 25 counties, showed the greatest covered employment increase in the seven years, 42.07 percent, considerably higher than the State average of 31.12 percent, but the wage increases in this region increased to an average of only 11.19 percent, as compared with the State average of 122.71 percent.

Buncombe County, this report shows, increased its average employment from 16,170 in 1940 to 24,303 in 1947, a gain of 50.30 percent. The county's average weekly wage increased from \$20.29 in 1940 to \$39.93 in 1947, a gain of 96.80 percent.
