**Violators Are Subject** To Fine, Imprisonment

**Canine Believed Afflicted** 

With Rabies Is Shot Here

For several years the area of Black Mountain Township has been free from an outbreak of rabies, probably due to the fine attendance at the clinics held for vaccination against rabies. Howvaccination against rabies. How-ever, on Saturday an incident oc-cured involving a dog which is believed to have been afflicted with rabies, and Dr. H. C. Whims, County Health Officer for Bun-combe county, has placed a 90 day quarantine on all dogs in the Black Mountain Township, in ac-cordance with the state law cover-ing such situations. This quarant-ine is in effect and will remain

ine is in effect and will remain so until June 30, 1951. The law provides that where an area is under quarantine all dogs in the district shall be confined on the premises of the owner, (preferably in an enclosure or if not on a chain) and that a dog may be permitted to leave the premises of the owner if on leash or under the control of its owner or other responsible person. The law further provides that when dogs continue to run at large, un-controlled by owners or persons responsible for their control, any police officer or deputy sheriff shall have the right to apprehend the dogs, killing them and dis-posing of their bodies. Violation of the law is a misdemeanor pun-isable by a fine of not more than ishable by a fine of not more than

\$50.00 or imprisonment of not more than 30 days. Notices of the quarantine have been posted throughout the town-ship, and county and city officials have endorsed the action taken by the Board of Health. Sheriff L. E. They warned the public against handling stray or injured dogs without taking proper precautions and urged full cooperation with the quarantine and attendance at rabies vaccination clinics. They too, all felt that the problem of stray dogs running at large was a serious one in this vicinity. People are warned . not to attempt to treat their own or other tempt to treat their own or other dogs if they appear sick or ab-normal in any way. Report them to your veterinarian. If a person is bitten, report the incident to the County Health Office and see your physician immediately. If the dog dies have the head ex-amined for rabies. Your veterinar-ian will assist in obtaining arian will assist in obtaining examination of the dog's head. If you shoot a dog, shoot him through the heart as shooting through the head interferes with the examination for rabies. J. L. Parris, County Dog Warden today outlined for public inform-ation the general symptoms of rabies. Dogs are the most com-mon carriers of the disease, Mr. Parris said, but it affects all warm-blooded animals and is us-nelly transmitted through a bitess.
