From Page 1, this Sec. accidents. The death total has risen steadily since the law was abolished. "The officers can go only so far as the public will permit," Captain Speed said. He believes that education of the public to observe traffic laws for personal safety and establishment of traffic courts under one head will help solve the problem. "But every citizen has a personal duty to help the law. If only officers are to enforce the law, then our system of government has come to an end. "The law enforcement agencies need the very finest material possible, and they can't get it without raising the pay," he concluded.
