Barbecued Hamburgers
Broadcast: June 23, 1951

1 lb. ground beef
1/2 cup rolled oats
3/4 cup Pet Milk
3 tablespoons finely cut onion
1 teaspoon salt
1/2 teaspoon pepper

3 tablespoons shortening
1/2 cup bottled barbecue sauce or catsup
8 round sandwich buns

Mix well meat, oats, milk, onion, salt and pepper. Shape in 8 flat patties. Brown slowly on both sides in hot shortening. Spread meat with equal parts of barbecue sauce. Cover and cook 5 min. Serve in toasted buns.
