Fried Corn
Broadcast: July 7, 1951

2 tablespoons shortening
1/2 cup finely cut onion
1/2 cup finely cut green pepper

No. 2 can whole kernel corn
1/4 teaspoon salt
few grains pepper
1/2 cup Pot Milk

Heat shortening in skillet. Add onion, green pepper, drained corn, salt and pepper. Cook slowly until corn is light brown. Stir in milk. Cook and stir over very low heat until sauce is just slightly thickened. Serve hot. Makes 4 servings.
