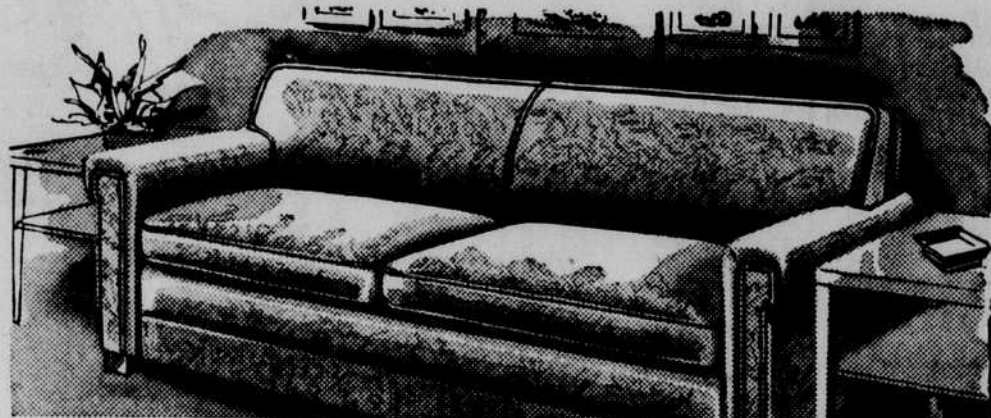
Mrs. Steinberg's sister, Miss Aneby Schuham, and niece, Miss Michele Schuham, of Coral Gables, were also guests.

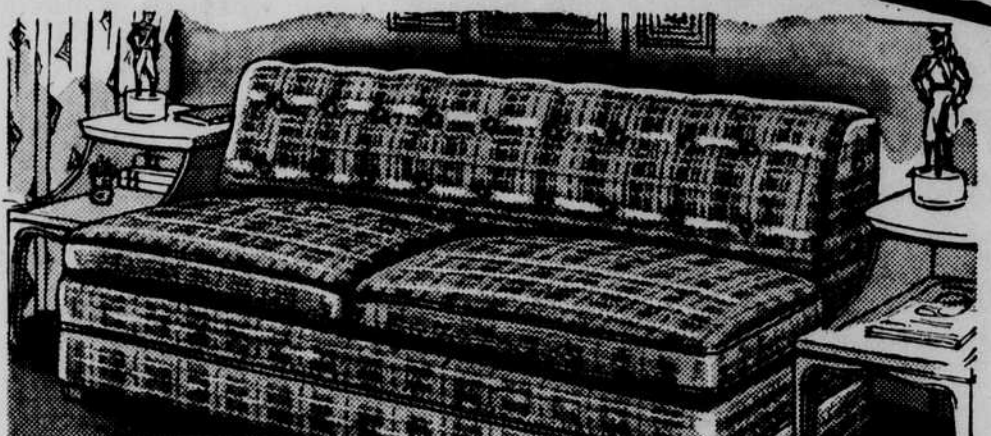

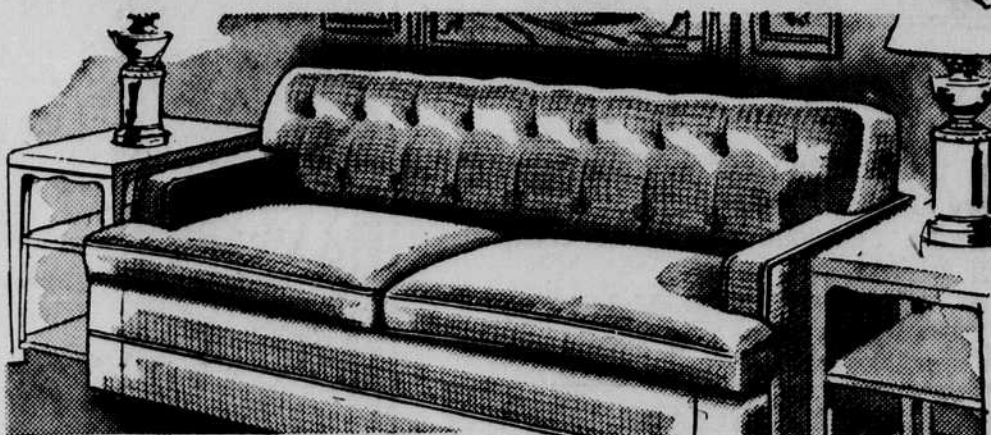
