Victoria hospital after a heart attack. His condition is serious this time.

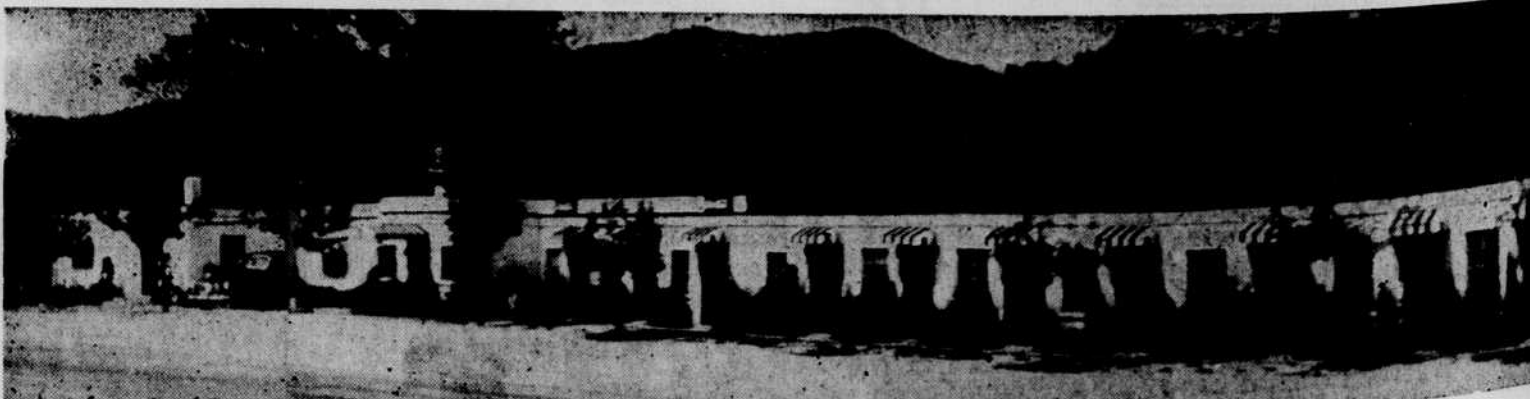
