West 290 feet to a stake in the south east corner of property belonging to the Black Mountain Presbyterian Church and now used as a Manse; thence South 80 Deg. West 125 feet to a stake; thence North 10 deg. West 35 feet to a stake; thence North 87 deg. 38' West 364.3 feet to a stake, said line being the south line of property belonging to Miss Irene B.
