The judges are impartial non-residents of the Finer Carolina area and will determine which town has the most illustrious and worthwhile projects and should be awarded the 24 prizes, totaling \$6,750.00 in cash for outstanding community achievement and developments.

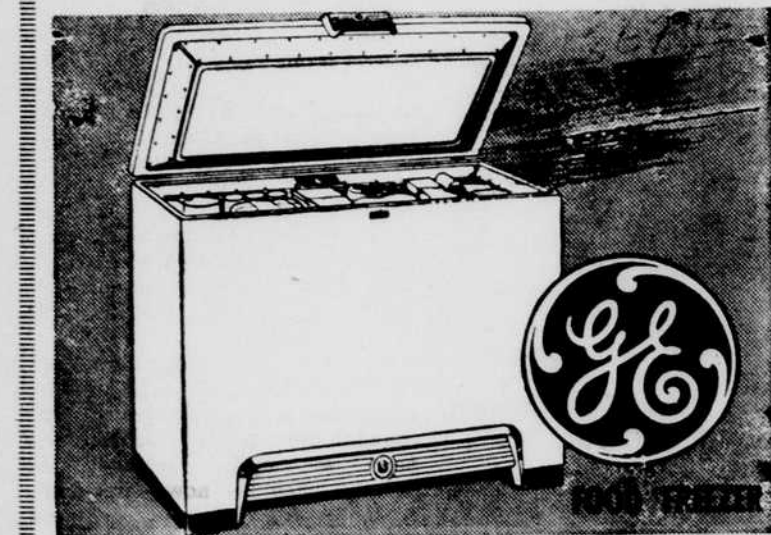
The Swannanoa projects are:  
 No. 1—Which is sponsored by the Woman's club, will be completed as soon as the walls are painted in the halls, lobby and wash rooms in the clubhouse. This work will be started very soon.  
 No. 2—Sponsored by the Men's club, will be completed as soon as concrete platform landing and steps are finished on the north side of the clubhouse and aluminum canopies installed over four outside doors.

No. 3—Sponsored by the Garden department, will run to the end of the year since this is mainly work which is done in conjunction with the Parent Teachers Ass., such as educational slides for the school children, nature studies, planting of shrubbery, etc.

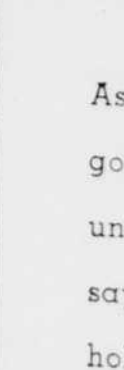
