When Arrest Is Legal
On the other hand, if the same thing had happened in Durham (just for example) the arrest without a warrant would have been perfectly legal and the person so arrested would have had no right to resist. This is true because a provision in the Durham City Charter permits arrest without a warrant for drunkenness and other types of lesser crime, whether or not the conduct of the accused breaches or threatens the public peace.
