

WASHINGTON REPORT

SENATE — Senator E. Eastland (Miss.) introduced a bill today to change the Federal Government's policy of buying surplus property to North Carolina.

A similar bill was introduced in Washington about two years ago. The bill would have a large part of the surplus property, equipment and supplies.

Under the program, North Carolina schools and hospitals have received real estate, equipment and supplies valued at over \$10 million dollars. They received equipment, paper, desks, chairs, tables, filing cabinets, all sorts of laboratory equipment and many other items that were declared surplus by the Federal Government.

SENATE — Asked together, it was a long list in the area for schools and hospitals that were in need of equipment at a time when they were making budgets.

Under a recent bill introduced in the Senate, the Defense Department would be required to offer all surplus material to the Department of Health, Education and Welfare for distribution to schools and hospitals before any sale.

SENATE — Senator Eastland is introducing his support of the measure, and it will be introduced in every Senate and educational institution in North Carolina.

"There is a tremendous need for the surplus equipment the schools and hospitals have been getting in the past," he said. "The State and local governments are unable to purchase equipment and supplies to replace what is worn out. There is a need at all very schools and hospitals throughout the State for the opportunity to obtain surplus equipment at a low price."

SENATE — The bill would be introduced in the Senate by Senator Eastland, chairman of the Government Operations committee, introduced the bill. The committee, of which Senator Eastland is a member, will hold hearings on the bill.
