creek bed. The time was 2:15 in the afternoon.

On Saturday morning the same party returned to the search, could not obtain a boat, but an owner said they could have one if they would bail out the water. Cavin, and Johnson did this and then pushed the craft off the sand. They returned to the scene, loaded their equipment, and, joined by Slagle, left the pier at approximately 1:20 p.m. Fifty minutes later they recovered the second body, that of Jimmy Israel, 19. He was found on the south side of the walls of the lake, believed to be in the old road bed, 150 feet from the spot where the body of Waldrop was found.

"Although the navy divers were searching all over that end of the lake, we stuck to our spot because of the lay of the land, the direction of the wind at the time the accident occurred, and our knowledge of the recurrent of the water," Mr. Cavin said.

Mr. Cavin believes that the third body may be in the vicinity of the place where the other two were found. He bases this on the fact that the sweatshirt and undershirt of the missing man were found on the bank, two feet from the water's edge, and appeared to have been torn off and thrown to shore. This would indicate that the missing youth had gone to the rescue of his companions or had started to swim to the point after they had been lost. That area covers a lot of water.

The missing boy is Larry Moore, 16. The search for his body is continuing. All three were from Whitney, S. C.
