Participating in the conferences which will be held in various cities throughout the state this fall will be county health department personnel, county medical society representatives, the American Cancer society unit volunteers and others.

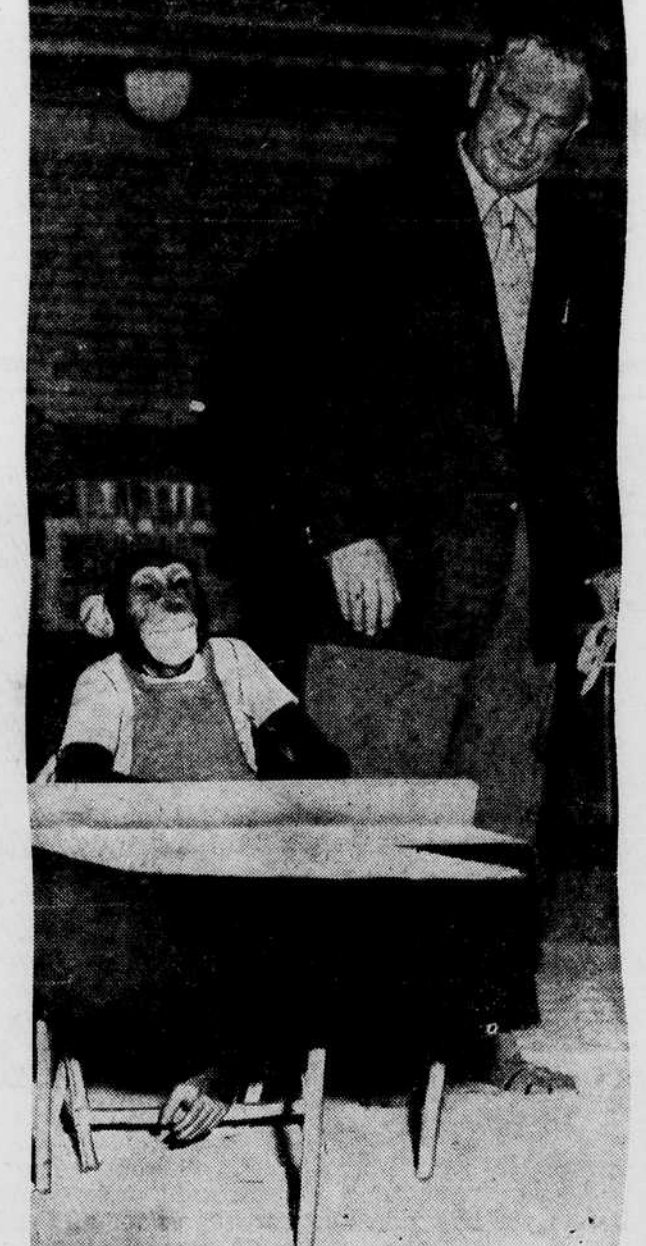
LIONS TO REPORT ON CALENDARS MONDAY
