## Crusader Castles Are Great Sights Of Bible Lands

Among the Bible Lands most fascinating attractions are son thirty Crusader Castles wh dot the countryside from the northern borders of Syria as I south as the Gulf of Agaba in Jordan. Built by the Crusader in two hundred years of tireless activity (1097-1291 A.D.), then castles sometimes stand on al most inaccessible mou peaks 6,000 feet high, someting are lapped at their foundation the waves of the Mediter-

Crusader Castles once guardthe pilgrimage route to the oly Places of Jerusalem, dending mountain passes and the coastal plains from the Moslems, offering hospitality and succor to pilgrims and sheltering neighring villages when wars reatened the countryside. The ost famous castle-builders of the period were the Knights Templars and Knights Hospitalers, two powerful monastic orders of the 12th and 13th centuries. The base city for the northern castles is Latakia, Syria's seaport on the Mediterranean, From here Sahyoun Castle can be visted in a half-day trip. It is disinguished by its dramatic rockneedle which once supported a drawbridge across a rock-cut channel 90 feet deep and 60 feet wide. In a day both the Castle of Markab, on a basalt mountain ridge overlooking the Mediterranean, and the Templars Castle and Crusader Church of Tartus can be visited. The Crusader Church, which is Gothic and very beautiful, should not
