CONDITIONS GIVEN FOR ADDITIONAL VA COMPENSATION

Only veterans receiving disability compensation from Veterans Administration for service-connected ailments rated 50 per cent or more disability may be entitled to additional allowances for dependents.

Joseph E. Porter of the VA office in the City Building in Asheville said dependents include the wife, minor children and dependent parents of eligible veterans.

He explained the law does not authorize payments for dependents of veterans whose service-connected disabilities are found to be less than 50 per cent in degree.

Veterans receiving pensions for non-service-connected disabilities also are not eligible, Mr. Porter said.

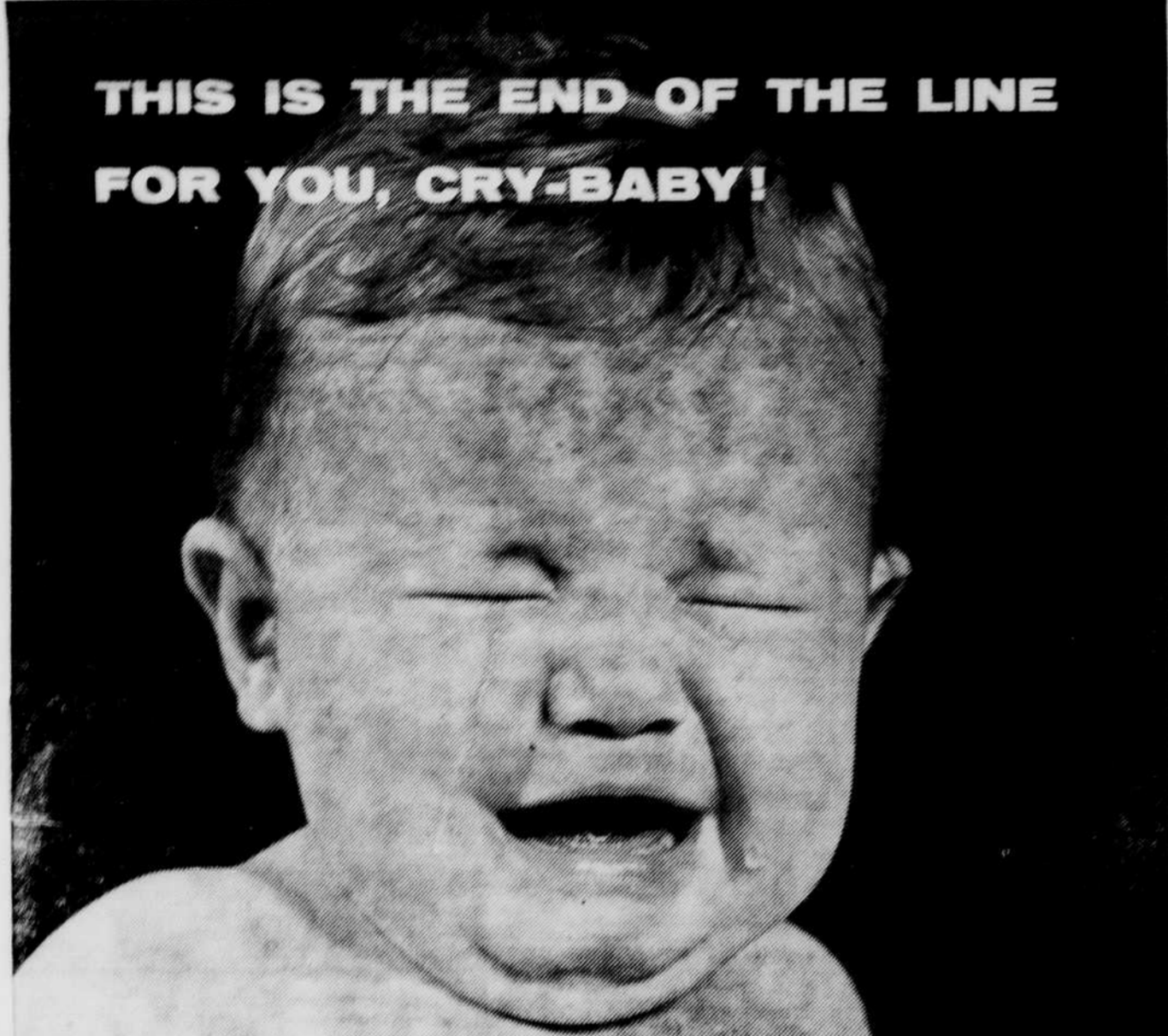
