lots so much each year per child per average daily attendance. Another source is from part of the standardization fee which each pupil pays at the beginning of the year. Of course all the fees paid for overdue and lost books are used to buy more books.

Every year some new piece of equipment is added to the library. This year it was a card catalogue file and stand which has been very helpful as well as adding to the pleasant appearance of the library. A new large file has also been added that contains a comprehensive amount of information about the Armed Forces to which the pupils can refer.

There are several ways in which the books are brought to the attention of the students. One way is through various displays in the lobby and study hall. The other is through a "teaser" on the charge desk in the library. Each day new books ("Any book is a new book until you have read it") are placed in a prominent display to make them enticing to the students.

We are very fortunate in having a trained librarian which enables Owen to offer classes in library science to the students. Besides relieving the librarian of a great deal of detail work, they receive a unit of credit toward graduation. It is the duty of the first and second period classes to file the old papers and magazines and put up the new ones. In addition, these classes, as well as the other

ers, replace the books and check books in and out, which leaves the librarian free to assist students in finding material. They also gain experience in filing cards, typing out book orders, accessioning and preparing new books, and being able to follow instructions. The last class of the day counts the cards of the books checked out that day and files them according to classification.

Those students who wish to take library science have to be approved by the librarian and the principal. Those taking this course this year are: First period; Dennis Glass, Shirley Byrd, and Jewel Stroud; second period; Bobby Ammons, Arthur Clayton, and Brenda Perkins; third period; Betty Kitchen, Claudia Law, and Terry Swann; fourth period; Francis Banks, Phyllis Pruitt, Carole Watkins, and Jean Waycaster; fifth period; Elaine Bastarache, Christine Hart, and Joyce Martin.

Now let us turn the spotlight on the lady who is greatly responsible for much of the above, Mrs. Carr, the school librarian. Mrs. Carr, who is from Chicago, Ill., originally taught foreign languages, having received her A.B. in French and Latin from Northwestern University. #### 30,444 Drivers Lose License

In a summary of license revocable traffic offenses, the Motor Vehicles department said today that 30,444 motorists lost their legal driving privileges during 1957.

Neck and neck at the top of the list were 11,906 drunk drivers and 11,804 speeders, the agency reported.

Both offenses require a mandatory surrender of drivers' license. Miscellaneous violations noted in the annual report showed reckless driving, 1799 convictions; improper use of operator's license, 489; transporting intoxicants, 359; and larceny of automobile, 207.

Additional penalties were prescribed for 1673 motorists caught driving after their license had been withdrawn, the department said.
